#### **Project Overview**

Delivering Primary Healthcare to Rural Communities, to bridge the healthcare accessibility gap in rural and remote areas by delivering comprehensive primary healthcare services through mobile medical units.

#### **Rationale:**

Many rural communities face shortage of healthcare facilities and staff, long travel distances to nearest health centers, financial and social barriers to care. Mobile Medical Units serve as a cost-effective, flexible solution to bring services directly to these populations.







#### Aim:

- Early diagnosis and treatment.
- Better management of chronic conditions like diabetes, hypertension, and arthritis.
- Identification of anaemia and communicable diseases due to poor socioeconomic conditions.
- Regular follow-up of the patients and referrals to emergency cases.
- Awareness programs to spread knowledge about health and hygiene to prevent serious diseases.





# Mobile medical units will provide the following Primary Healthcare Services

- General outpatient care including fever, infections, and minor injuries; maternal and child healthcare; adolescent and elderly care.
- Basic diagnostics such as blood pressure, glucose, hemoglobin, and malaria screening.
- Health education and counseling covering nutrition, hygiene, and family planning.
- Regular follow-ups to monitor patients for the efficiency and effectiveness of the treatment program and Referral services for complicated cases.



Panipat-542, Narmada-630, Patiala-509, Baramulla-630. Total no. of Beneficiaries=2311


#### District wise Beneficiaries count








#### **Genderwise analysis of Beneficiaries**






# Special Camp on Communicable Diseases in Patiala

Due to Monsoon there is rise in Communicable Diseases in Patiala. Gastroenteritis, Dengue and Typhoid are more prominent among people during the month of July-August. A special camp on screening, diagnosis and treatment of communicable diseases was conducted in Patiala on 23<sup>rd</sup> July 2025.

#### **Details:**

Total no. of Beneficiaries- 47 % Male-61%, Female-39% Communicable Diseases- 48% (Gastroenteritis-37%, Respiratory Infection-7%, Typhoid-4%).

Patients with severe conditions were referred to Community Health Centre.

## Special Camp on Communicable Diseases in Baramulla

Due to Monsoon, there is a rise in Communicable Diseases like Gastroenteritis, Dengue and Typhoid among people in Baramulla during the months of June-August. A special camp on screening, diagnosis and treatment of communicable diseases was conducted in Baramulla on 3<sup>rd</sup> July 2025.

#### **Details:**

Total no. of Beneficiaries- 41 % Male-29%, Female-7% % of Communicable Diseases- 39% (Gastroenteritis-10%, Respiratory Infection-24%, Urinary Tract Infection-5%)

Patients with severe conditions were referred to GMC, Baramulla.
